A fearless Da'ee

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During the Khilafat of Umar (Radiyallahu Anhu) the Muslim army reached the Persian empire. A battle took place which was called the Battle of Qadisiyya. Among the Muslim army there was a Sahabi whose name was Rabi bin Amir (Radiyallahu Anhu). Rustam said "Let him come to me." Rabi (Radiyallahu Anhu) then walked on the carpet with the help of his spear in such a way that a large part of the carpet was torn away. The attendants were then scared by his behaviour and asked "Why did you come here in our land?"




Rabi (Radiyallahu Anhu) gave Dawah to them and said, "Allah has sent us so that we may take mankind from the worship of mankind to the worship of Allah, and take them out from the business of this temporary world to the business of the Akhirah, and from the injustice of false religion to the Justice of Islam. We are trying to introduce mankind to the Deen of Allah so that they may worship Him. Whosoever will acknowledge it, they will be accepted by us and we will go back. This was because Nabi (Sallallahu Alaihi wa Sallam) suggested that they give 3 days for the Kuffar to think before starting any battle. They were even more surprised so they asked him, "Are you the Muslim chief?" Rabi (Radiyallahu anhu) answered "No, but all Muslims are like a single body, even the lowest of them can take a decision on behalf of their highest one."





After that he gave them 3 days to think and returned from the court. The people could not believe that such a simple ragged person did such bold things and said such bold words in their noble court. They kept talking about his appearance and clothes. Rustam himself also got surprised then said to his people, "Woe to you! Do not look at his clothes - look at his views, his speech and his character. The Arabs do not spend much on their clothes and meals but they protect their lineage."
